



Jouya Jadidian is currently a Ph.D. student in the Department of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), Cambridge, MA.

His current research interests include plasma processing, advanced dielectrics, NEMS/MEMS devices, semiconductor manufacturing, remote sensing and current interruption.
